
### Goal

- 2. You decide on first concrete steps towards co-authorship


# My personal opinion

- Your commitment should be realistic
- Small steps are ok
- General ideas:
  - Transfer/application of existing ideas
  - Co-development
  - Contribution through discussion and writing
- The PhD supervisor must support such a collaboration

- 5-7 PI volunteers for the conversation
- Students: Consider with which person you would like to write a paper together
- Meet in groups of 2-4 people



- 1. Inner circle discussion (~12 minutes)
- 2. Outer circle defines questions (~5 minutes)
- 3. Outer circle asks questions (~12 minutes)



- 2. Share your observations and questions that came to your mind.

Make sure everyone gets to contribute.

  - **Students:** What are concrete actions that you can do without additional resources, to work towards coauthorship with another person at ConVeY?
  - **PIs:** What are concrete actions that you can do, to help your students in co-authorship with other ConVeY students?
- 10 minutes: Meet with your groups and share your ideas/ intentions turn by turn. Then write down the first steps you want to commit to.
- 10 minutes: Share your commitment. We can revisit this at the next retreat.

Just 15% is enough!

- Set small, realistic steps.
- Make concrete plans (when, where, how, who's involved?)
